But there is much YOU can do as well!!!



FROM THE SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR

I have often heard it said that some of the finest things in life have been scribbled on a cocktail napkin. In fact I have even heard that Abraham Lincoln scribbled the famous words to the Gettysburg Address on a napkin in route to Gettysburg. These days I think the whole napkin thing could be changed to say that some of the greatest things are posted on Social Media. I often find myself looking at the posts and seeing various nuggets of wisdom on there. That was the case yesterday. While scrolling I found, "Stop being afraid of what could go wrong and start being positive about what could go right." This resonated with me because I tend to try to reason through everything that I do and choose. As I do this I tend to overthink everything, especially the negative outcomes. This process goes on so long that sometimes I become paralyzed and frozen out of fear of making the wrong decision. Anyone else relate to that?

As I read the piece of advice yesterday I was reminded of the story told in Matthew about the disciples. Following the feeding of the 5,000 plus, Jesus put the disciples into a boat and told them to cross to the other side of the lake while he went up on a hillside to pray. They got to the middle of the lake and a storm arose about the time that Jesus was going to cross over. Seeing their peril he began walking to them on the water. When the disciples saw him they thought it was a ghost. Until Jesus said to them fear not, come to me. Now check my math but at that invitation there were 12 on the boat and yet only one, impetuous Peter dared to get out of the boat.

The question keeps repeating itself in my head is why did the other 11 remain in the boat? Were they afraid of sinking? Did it not seem rational that they could walk on water? Were they so paralyzed with all of the what ifs that they decided to remain hunkered down in the relative safety of a boat on a stormy sea?

My point here is one of encouragement for us as followers of Jesus Christ. I believe that we are called to leave our relative safety of the boat that we feel most comfortable in to take a leap of faith as Peter did by trusting the

Lord to take those first few steps on the water. I believe that God has a mission for each of us individually and for this community and for the world in the name of Jesus Christ. My question to each of us is will we "Stop being afraid of what could go wrong and start being positive about what could go right?

That is a thought worth pondering.

KAIROS KORNER

Kairos Fall Weekends

The Kairos teams for Kairos #69 at Greensville Correctional Center and Kairos #6 at Sussex-1 State Prison have started teaming for their weekends on October 12 – 15 for K-69 and October 19 – 22 for K-6. So, that means it is **Cookie Time** and **Prayer Chain Time**!

Homemade cookies are a tangible and meaningful expression of God's unconditional agape love for the incarcerated and are a very important part of each Kairos weekend. Each team will take approximately 2,400 dozen (!) cookies into the prison for a Kairos weekend, which includes enough to provide one dozen cookies to each inmate in each prison in addition to the participants and team over the weekend. Cookie instructions are available on the team website at: https://kairosnova.org. Also, instructions for delivering the cookies to each team will be available on the website as the weekends draw near.

While the cookies demonstrate God's amazing love, the Kairos weekends are powered by prayer as we seek the Holy Spirit to watch over each weekend and touch each participant's heart with God's love and forgiveness in a new and powerful way. Links to the prayer chain sign-up list, divided into 30 minute slots, and prayer guides for both K-69 and K-6 will be posted to the team website in the near future. A paper prayer chain is then created by the team consisting of paper chain links with the name and State of the prayer partner for each 30 minute slot. This prayer chain is shared with the participants during one of the talks on Friday morning as a powerful demonstration that they are not alone on this new journey with Christ. Please join many others from around the world, including Kairos brothers on death row, in praying for the participants and team.
