FROM THE NCA EMMAUS COMMUNITY LAY DIRECTOR

Our monthly Ultreyas are always times of refreshing my spirit, but this past month's gathering was especially uplifting. We introduced the team of E 183 and the new "pilgrims", the ladies of E 182. The air was electric with excitement as we sang "Old Church Choir" and danced our way through "Undignified". Just like David danced before the Lord in the Psalms, our ladies worshiped our Lord in a beautiful undignified dance!!!

"Now, friends, I want to report on the surprising and generous ways in which God is working in the "churches" (Emmaus). " 2 Corinthians 8:1. Read the rest of the chapter! It is a very encouraging passage on how the church reached out and helped because they saw a need. Our Emmaus community heard the plea for pilgrims for E 183 and responded. By the night of the Ultreya there were 23 men who had agreed to attend the weekend. The call had triggered an outpouring of pure and generous love from many who eagerly looked for pilgrims to sponsor. Tonight, as I sit writing this article, I received a message saying that they now have 27 men who have said "yes"!!! What was looking very discouraging just a short time ago, caught us completely off guard and spurred us to action. We hope that each of you will plan to attend our next Ultreya which will be our annual business meeting. We will be gathering at 6:00 PM at Christ Church to vote on the board for the year 2018 and discuss other important

business matters. Christ Church will be providing a meal which will be served at 6:45- 7:30. I encourage you to come and hear some of the wonderful things that God is doing in our midst.

FROM THE SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR

I recently attended my 40th High School Reunion. This was an event that I had been involved with over the past 10 months, serving on the planning team. When the big night arrived I was keenly aware of two observations. The first was that while I have not changed much in the last 40 years, everyone else had aged beyond belief. The second observation was really much deeper.

When our team of five arrived an hour plus more before the event we found a very nice but bland country club dining room. Sure, it was very elegant but there was no color whatsoever. In the hour that followed the room was completely transformed. It changed from a classy all white to an orange and blue extravaganza. There were balloons, there were streamers, there were megaphones, there were table scarves, well I could on and on, but I think you get the picture.

What struck me that night was how similar this experience was to what happens in the lives of pilgrims when they experience an Emmaus weekend. They arrive with anxiety, uncertainty and a degree of trepidation. But over the weekend their lives are transformed from a casual black and white relationship with Jesus Christ to a full on colorful experience of the Risen Christ. In essence, the team and the community color their world.

Dear friends, it is my prayer and hope that as we move forward we always bear in mind that the weekend is a transformative event for the PILGRIMS. Teaming is certainly a meaningful experience for all who do so. However, teaming must never become the end and ultimate goal of the Emmaus community. We exist not only to celebrate and worship God in a colorful way but we also exist to pass on the love of Christ with other people.

As we move forward toward a new year may we keep ever before us the need to pray that God will open the hearts of people to experience the weekend so that more

and more people may experience the transformation of the weekend experience.
